Synopsis:

Just after midnight, a snowdrift stops the Orient Express in its tracks. The luxurious train is surprisingly full for the time of the year, but by morning it is one passenger fewer. An American tycoon lies dead in his compartment, stabbed eight times, his door locked from the inside. Isolated and with a killer in their midst, the passengers rely on detective Hercule Poirot to identify the murderer – in case he or she decides to strike again.

We encourage members of diverse backgrounds and abilities to audition for our productions.

Requirements:

- Auditions will consist of group readings from the script.
- Actors should familiarize themselves with the audition sides located HERE
- A tentative rehearsal calendar will be provided upon auditioning. Rehearsal conflicts must be noted on the audition form.
- Resumes and headshots are welcomed but not required.
- Auditionees should plan on arriving at the beginning and staying for the entirety of the audition or until dismissed by the director.

CASTING THE FOLLOWING ROLES:

NOTE: Actors must be able to represent the age ranges in the character descriptions. Please note accent requirements associated with specific characters.

CHARACTERS

HERCULE POIROT — Male. 40s-60s. Belgian.

Retired police force. A brilliant detective and very much knows it. Witty, precise, & charming.

MOUNSIEUR BOUC — Male. 30s-50s. Belgian.

Owner of Wagon-Lit train company & The Orient Express. A friend and fan of Hercule Poirot.

MARY DEBENHAM — Female. Late 20s. English.

Former governess to Daisy—a little girl murdered 4 years ago. In a relationship with Arbuthnot.

HECTOR MacQUEEN — Male. 30s. American.

Ratchett's nervous secretary.

MICHEL THE CONDUCTOR* — Male. 40s. French.

Conductor of The Orient Express, and does his job well. Father of Daisy's former maid.

PRINCESS DRAGOMIROFF — Female. 70s. Russian.

Despicable & rude. Speaks her mind and no more.

GRETA OHLSSON — Female. 30s. Swedish.

Daisy's former nurse. Awkward & delicate. A medical missionary to children in Africa.

COUNTESS ANDRENYI — Female. 20s-30s. Hungarian.

Nobility. Enchanting & mysterious as a fairy tale. Former doctor who volunteered in the war.

HELEN HUBBARD — Female, 50s, American.

Outspoken and flamboyant. Speaks her mind at all times to a fault. Sings and Dances.

COLONEL ARBUTHNOT* — Male. 30s. Scottish.

An officer unafraid to make demands, yet has a warm side to him. In a relationship with Mary.

SAMUEL RATCHETT* — Male. 40s. American.

Physically threatening and a bully. Gets his way. Has many enemies. Carries a gun at all times.

HEAD WAITER* — Male. 30s/40s

Runs the Istanbul Hotel Dining Room. Self-confident to a fault.
